About the Workshop

The workshop aims to analyze climate migration from a socio-environmental, educational, and cultural perspective, drawing on experiences in Brazil and their application across Latin America and the Caribbean. It is structured around three fundamental axes: understanding the phenomenon, embracing the role of universities, and contributing actionable alternatives. The discussion will explore how education, culture, and universities can serve as key tools for adapting to and integrating climate migrants, as well as transforming host communities.

Learning Objectives

- Understanding climate migration in Brazil and its relevance to Latin America and the Caribbean.
- Reflecting on the role of education and universities in the adaptation of migrants.
- Analyzing strategies of resistance and action from civil society and solidarity networks. Exploring the challenges in training social scientists on this topic.
- Generating proposals based on education and culture to strengthen affected communities.
