DECOLONIZING PSYCHOTHERAPY WITH IMMIGRANTS: DECENTERING WESTERN PRAXIS

Pre-Congress Workshop

About the Workshop

Facilitators will describe a theoretical framework that integrates Testimonial Praxis with Liberation Psychology praxis to understand the therapeutic tasks and ways of being that disrupt Western psychotherapy methods when engaging with immigrants. Participants will learn strategies that center the immigration experience, will be able to critically examine both their positionality and their theoretical orientation, and will understand the complexities, challenges, and opportunities of decolonizing therapy approaches with immigrants.

Learning Objectives

- Expand knowledge base regarding the immigration experience, phases of immigration, and the psychological consequences.
- Delineate culturally affirming practices when working with immigrant populations
- Describe a theoretical framework that integrates Testimonial Praxis with Liberation Psychology principals when working with immigrant populations.
- Demonstrate integration of conceptual frameworks and strategies through case vignettes.
